Meeting objectives

There is strong evidence that patient involvement, engagement and empowerment have the potential to improve not only patient satisfaction with care, but also the quality of care provided and patient outcomes. Patient engagement recognises that patients have unique insights into their conditions, treatment outcomes and quality of life. By actively involving patients in research, drug development, clinical trials, regulatory decisions and post-marketing surveillance, healthcare stakeholders can use this wealth of knowledge to improve patient outcomes. In clinical trials, for example, patient involvement helps to ensure that trials are designed in a way that is relevant and meaningful to patients. Patients can also contribute to the development of patient-reported outcome measures, which are used to assess the impact of treatments on their quality of life.

In such activities, patients and healthcare professionals work in equal partnership to promote and support patients' active involvement in improving their health and healthcare, as well as in research and innovation.

This hybrid public meeting, which is part of the initiatives of the **CLOSER** project (Overcoming distance between South America and Europe Regions), is being organised to discuss approaches and opportunities for engaging patients, patient groups, leukemia experts, and experts on studies and clinical trials. The meeting will focus on how to best understand patients' experiences and how to incorporate those experiences and priorities throughout their health care and their treatments, clinical trials, research and innovation.

Designed as an interactive roundtable to give patients, researchers and institutions a voice, the meeting will consist of several moments. The first will focus on patient engagement in treatments, and the second will see speakers discuss on the role of the patient in innovation and research.

Session 1: Effective engagement of patients in their health care and treatment

Patients and their families play a crucial role in the healthcare system and drive changes in health culture. Patient engagement focuses on making sure that patients and providers work together to improve the patient's health. In order to create patient engagement strategies that allow patients to become actively engaged in gathering information and making decisions about their symptoms, illnesses, and treatment options, providers need to empower the patient to have a voice in their healthcare experience. In this session, panelists will discuss the current situation in Europe and Latin America.

Session 2: Engaging patients in research and innovation

Patients can also be key drivers of Research and Innovation in Health. There are plenty of examples on how, if listened to carefully, patients, families and carers can be at the centre of change. In this session, we will look at how the R&I actors (from the funders to the developers) are starting to take patients more into account from the very beginning of the innovation processes. Clinical trial developers are ensuring patients voice along the whole procedure, companies take patient onboard during its R&I and the initiatives from patients are supported by the funding authorities. Both EU and LATAM cases will be discussed.
